Introduction

The *Instructional Leadership Programme* (ILP), facilitated by Professor Barrie Bennett through Education and Training Boards Ireland (ETBI), is a programme of professional learning aimed at enhancing teaching and learning at primary, post-primary, and further education levels.

In 2021, The IL Programme National Steering
Committee published a strategic plan aimed at further developing the programme. The plan, 2021 – 2023, set out actions under four key priority areas:

- The programme aims to: Encourage teachers to consciously modify their instructional actions to maximise student learning. Facilitate the conscious and deliberate utilisation of teacher actions – skills, tactics & strategies, Foster an awareness of how a teacher's actions Can impact on student learning - motivation, novelty, authenticity, accountability, and safety. Re/Acquaint teachers with the extent to which learning is affected by; diverse learning styles, multiple intelligences, 'at risk environment' etc. Enhance classroom management and support the development of effective student teacher relationships. Encourage / support review – individual / subject dept/school levels.
- Develop a plan for the sustainable delivery of the programme.
- Develop a support structure for graduate school leaders and graduate teachers.
- Facilitate and support Research and Evaluation.
- Develop partnerships at National and International levels.

While 2020 was a period of challenge due to COVID 19 and the subsequent curtailment of activities, members of the Steering Committee and the IL administrator worked tirelessly to support the programme development and delivery.

We are pleased to publish this report, which outlines the progress made for the actions set out under each of the priority areas.






Instructional Leadership Reflection - Research Design
